Immunization Considerations

As we are not equipped for individual medical consultations, we are not issuing guidelines or individual recommendations, but we do want to provide this information to you to aid your trip preparation.

You may wish to consult organizations such as the CDC, NIH or WHO. There are several travel-med clinics in South Orange County.

Take into account that most vaccines require time for the body to build antibodies or develop immunities, and that some vaccines and prescriptions require a doctor's visit, so do not wait until the last minute to pursue any needed medical care or consultation.

Typical (often received in childhood, may need booster)

MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)

DPT (Diphtheria, Pertussis, Tetanus)

Varicella (for those who haven't had chicken pox)

Polio

Seasonal / Occasional

Influenza vaccine covers flu & H1N1

TB skin test (verification of non-exposure to tuberculosis)

3rd World Travel

Typhoid (oral or injected)

Hepatitis A, B

Malaria pills (daily or weekly)
